



Sports Premium Grant 2020- 2021

End of year review:

Whilst the pandemic may have restricted opportunities for external sporting activities, new opportunities were recognised to ensure the legacy of enjoying fitness, sport and healthy living continued. When pupils were in school, the PE teacher reorganised resources and restructured PE lessons to maintain Government guidelines without impacting upon the usual high standards. Pupils enhanced their spatial awareness, honed their sporting skills and used their prior learning and knowledge to devise new versions of sport and PE to stay safe whilst keeping fit. Technology became a key part of PE delivery when pupils were in school, at home or in the school hubs during lockdowns. The Joe Wicks 15 minute workout became a 'must' for all pupils and the PE teacher recorded her own videos shared on Google classroom for pupils and their families to work out to. Community involvement continued with an ex parent who runs a local gym. He adapted his lessons to give a socially distanced HIIT workout for Year 6 pupils, continuing to build their confidence, self-awareness and commoradary.

Year 6 pupils achieved brilliantly in their final term, demonstrating their resilience and retention of skills in swimming. They had been well on track in Yr 4 to achieve their 25m plus and were only able to attend 6 sessions of swimming in the final term. Although the total number of pupils achieving 25m plus was slightly lower than originally hoped, 8 children achieved 100m plus which is an amazing achievement. All pupils also participated in water safety training.
