We are excited for our inquiry learning this term, learning about the importance of relationships and how they build a community. We will share the different communities we are a part of and talk about what we are responsible for in those communities. During a special assembly at the start of the Module, we learned about our link school and their community in Malawi. We have written questions for the pupils of Sele school to send so that we can compare our communities, finding out what is the same and what is different.

Kent County Council will deliver a Road Safety workshop to pupils and we will also have a visit from a local Police Officer. These enrichment opportunities ensure we are supporting your children to make connections within their learning. They also help us to show the Learner Profile Attributes of being principled and caring.

Through history, we will look at the roles of Florence Nightingale and Edith Cavell. In PSHE, we are linking a lot of our learning about Safety to our inquiry around communities working together. In Maths, we are continuing to develop our number sense and working on making numbers to 20 in different ways. We have started using Numbots online and a login was sent home for you to use with your child if you wish.
