This module in maths, we'll be building on our understanding of place value before moving on to addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. The children will have lots of opportunities to practise their skills and apply them to problem-solving activities. In English, our core text will be *Holes*, which we'll use as inspiration for different types of writing, including a diary entry, a newspaper article and a persuasive piece. We'll also be working on ways to make our writing more effective by using expanded noun phrases for detail and figurative language to bring our ideas to life.

We will be covering locational skills, including map work, as well as learning about Ancient Greece by exploring everyday life, key achievements, and their influence on the western world. We will also be thinking about human rights and the impact they have had on communities, both in the past and today.

In science, we will be learning about the human lifecycle and the changes that happen at each stage of life. This will include exploring the physical and emotional changes that occur during puberty. Parents are advised that some lessons will cover sensitive topics related to puberty and the changes that occur, and children will be supported to discuss these changes in a safe and respectful way.

In PSHE, we will be focusing on building positive friendships and developing our social skills to work well with others. In computing, we will be learning about online safety, including how to stay safe and responsible when using the internet and digital devices.
